PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that there has been presented to the Town Board of the Town of Amity, Allegany County, New York, on the / day of *April*, 1971, Local Law of the year 1971 entitled "A Local Law continuing as elective the offices of assessors of the Town of Amity, Allegany County, New York", which provides as follows:

"BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Amity, Allegany County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. It is the purpose of this Local Law to continue the election of the assessors of the Town of Amity, Allegany County, New York, as provided by the law in effect immediately prior to the effective date of this Local Law as provided in Section 1556 of the Real Property Tax Law.

Section 2. The elective offices of Town Assessors of the Town of Amity, Allegany County, New York, shall hereafter continue to be elective offices as provided by the law in effect on the effective date of Section 1556 of the Real Property Tax Law and all other applicable sections pertinent thereto, provided that the elected assessors shall, in all other respects, comply with the provisions of Section 1522 of the Real Property Tax Law except that such assessors shall not be required to meet the minimum qualification standards established for such office or offices by the State Baord.

Section 3. This Local Law is subject to and shall become effective upon approval of a majority of the electors voting at a special town election to be held on the *15* day of *June*, 1971. Such election shall be conducted upon notice to be given and held in the manner provided in Section 23 and 25 of the Municipal Home Rule Law."

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Amity, Allegany County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. It is the purpose of this Local Law to continue the election of the assessors of the Town of Amity, Allegany County, New York as provided by the law in effect immediately prior to the effective date of this Local Law as provided in Section 1556 of the Real Property Tax Law.
